This request should be received by the City Administrator before Friday at noon preceding the meeting. No action or formal comment will be taken on such request at the council meeting. Staff will follow up in a timely manner during regular business hours following the meeting.

#### **ORDINANCE NO. 16-222**

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ZONING REGULATIONS OF THE CITY OF VALLEY FALLS, KANSAS, AS ORIGINALLY ADOPTED BY ORDINANCE NO. 16-201, AND INCORPORATING AS A PART THEREOF AMENDMENTS TO, ARTICLE 12 "CP-4" PLANNED CENTRAL BUSINESS DISTRICT REGULATIONS, SECTION 102 USE REGULATIONS, 2 RESIDENTIAL USES.

**THAT WHEREAS** on June 5, 2024, the City of Valley Falls, Kansas enacted Ordinance No. 16-222, of the City of Valley Falls, Kansas for said City, official copies of the same being on file with the City Clerk; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Valley Falls City Council has prior hereto and after given due notice held a public hearing on June 5, 2024 and made certain recommendations for amendments as contained herein; and

**WHEREAS**, the Governing Body of the City of Valley Falls, Kansas desires to approve such amendments to the Zoning Regulations in accordance therein;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF VALLEY FALLS, KANSAS;

**Section 1.** That in Article 12 "CP-4" Planned Central Business District Regulations, Section 102 Use Regulations, 2 shall be amended as follows:

### 2. Residential Uses:

- a. Residential Use shall not be allowed on the first floor, ground level, or any basement level floor of any building or structure within this district.
- **Section 2.** That Article 12, Section 102 shall otherwise remain unchanged.
- **Section 3.** This Ordinance shall take effect after its publication once in the official city newspaper.

### City Administrator Report City Council June 5, 2024

### **Daily Operations:**

- Assist Citizens with service payments & questions.
- Continuing to update information for the Hazard Mitigation Plan.
- Citizen Notification System—Keith Jeffers and I discussed the system again. The city will be able to use it at no cost. The county is currently adjusting the system's settings and will host training on how to use it.
- Working on grant paperwork for grants currently in progress.
- Submitted financial Audit documentation for the 2023 year. Auditors are processing our data.
- I met with the VF Rec Commission Director regarding the walking trail on Thursday, May 30<sup>th</sup>.
- Purple Wave auction for the surplus equipment will end on June 11<sup>th</sup>.
- I have a meeting scheduled for Friday Afternoon with the regional manager for Casey's. Several items are on the agenda to help improve communications and working relationships between them and the city.
- The transition of GWorks (go Live date) is Wednesday, June 5<sup>th</sup>.
- We are in the process of sending out round 2 of the lead line surveys. We are mailing them to the addresses that did not submit the completed survey. Please return the survey to the city office or complete the form online.
- We now accept credit card payments for the RV Park. We have posted signs on the post at the RV park with directions on how to rent a site.
- Park improvements: Installed the new tables using the waste tire grant, Public Works painted the restrooms, installed new dispensers, repaired lighting, installed new code entry locks on restroom doors, and installed new security cameras.
- Free Wi-Fi in the park. The city partnered with Giant Communications out of Holton to offer free Wi-Fi in the park. A sign posted in the park has the Wi-Fi password and the code for the restroom doors.
- The city has been awarded the KDOT Innovative Technology Program grant. We will work with KDOT to order and place the moveable radar signs, which we will post at various locations around the city.

### **EXECUTIVE SESSION MOTIONS**

There is no standard format for the motion to recess into executive session which will apply to all situations. Because the statutory language requires the motion contain both the "justification" and the "subjects" to be discussed, the motion should include the statutory reason for recessing into executive session and a more specific description of the topic for discussion.

1. Statutory reason for non –elected personnel needs a more specific reason which could be Individual employee's performance

I move the city council recess into executive session to discuss an individual employee's performance pursuant to the **non-elected personnel** matter exception, K.S.A. 75-4319 (b) (1) to include: (people to participate besides governing body.) The open meeting will resume in the city council room at \_\_\_\_PM.

2. Statutory reason for Attorney – Client privilege needs a more specific reason which could be discuss contract, Litigation, Claim, or other such more specific item.

I move the city council recess into executive session to discuss a claim pursuant to **Attorney – Client privilege** matter exception, K.S.A. 75-4319(b)(2) to include: the City Attorney and (people to participate besides governing body.) The open meeting will resume in the city council room at \_\_\_\_\_PM.

- 3. For employer-employee negations a more specific description could be salary. I move the city council recess into executive session to discuss salary pursuant to employer-employee negotiations matter exception, K.S.A. 75-4319(b) (3) to include: (people to participate besides governing body.) The open meeting will resume in the city council room at \_\_\_\_\_PM.
- 4. For property acquisition matters a more specific description could be purchase cost. I move the city council recess into executive session to preliminary discuss purchase cost pursuant to property acquisition matter exception, K.S.A. 75-4319(b)(6) to include: (people to participate besides governing body.) The open meeting will resume in the city council room at \_\_\_\_\_PM.
- **K.S.A. 75-4319.** Closed or executive meetings; conditions; authorized subjects for discussion; binding action prohibited; certain documents identified in meetings not subject to disclosure. (a) Upon formal motion made, seconded and carried, all bodies and agencies subject to the open meetings act may recess, but not adjourn, open meetings for closed or executive meetings. Any motion to recess for a closed or executive meeting shall include a statement of (1) the justification for closing the meeting, (2) the subjects to be discussed during the closed or executive meeting and (3) the time and place at which the open meeting shall resume. Such motion, including the required statement, shall be recorded in the minutes of the meeting and shall be maintained as a part of the permanent records of the body or agency. Discussion during the closed or executive meeting shall be limited to those subjects stated in the motion. (b) No subjects shall be discussed at any closed or executive meeting, except the following:
- (1) Personnel matters of nonelected personnel;
- (2) consultation with an attorney for the body or agency which would be deemed privileged in the attorney-client relationship;
- (3) matters relating to employer-employee negotiations whether or not in consultation with the representative or representatives of the body or agency;
- (4) confidential data relating to financial affairs or trade secrets of corporations, partnerships, trusts, and individual proprietorships;
- (5) matters relating to actions adversely or favorably affecting a person as a student, patient or resident of a public institution, except that any such person shall have the right to a public hearing if requested by the person;
- (6) preliminary discussions relating to the acquisition of real property;
